Purpose: B. The Geography collection is primarily intended to support undergraduate research and teaching to the Bachelor level as well as individual faculty projects.

Academic Programs Served:

C. The Geography collection supports programs primarily in the Department of Geography. Degrees are offered at the Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science levels in Geography as well as the Bachelor level in Secondary Science Education. Various aspects of Geography are of interest to other disciplines such as Anthropology, Economics, Education, History, Political Science, and Science Education and Environmental Studies.

Collection Guidelines:

D. Languages: Materials are collected primarily in English. The acquisition of materials in Western European languages is highly selective.

Chronology: All chronological periods are collected. Current materials and imprints are emphasized.

Geography: There are no geographic restrictions on this collection. Emphasis is on North American and Western European imprints.

Notes/Comments:

Lower and upper division textbooks are excluded except upon specific faculty request. Emphasis is on economic and environmental geography, exploration, human and physical geography, geographic information science, and urban planning.
