Collection Guidelines:

D. Languages: Materials are collected in English only.

Chronology: Current materials and imprints are emphasized.

Geography: Emphasis is on research conducted in North America, England, and Australia. Translated works from Western Europe are acquired selectively. North American and Western European imprints are emphasized.
