Collection Guidelines:

D. Languages: Materials are collected primarily in English.

Chronology: All chronological periods are collected. Current imprints are Emphasized.

Geography: There are no geographic restrictions on authors in the field. Emphasis is on North American and Western European imprints.

Notes/Comments:

Lower and upper division textbooks are excluded. Areas of special emphasis include the history of religion and world religions.
