C. The Sociology collection supports programs primarily in the Sociology Department. Degrees are offered at the Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science levels, the Bachelor of Science level in Secondary Education, the Master level in Sociology, as well as a minor in Criminal Justice. Various aspects of Sociology are of interest to other disciplines such as Anthropology, Education, Psychology, Public Health, and Social Work.

Collection Guidelines:

D. Languages: Materials are collected in English only.

Chronology: Emphasis is on current research and issues in the field but materials on social welfare history are also collected. Current materials and imprints are emphasized.

Geography: The United States is emphasized. International sociology materials are collected selectively. North American and Western European imprints are emphasized.
